Two companies considered for bids will allow members of our fellowship to go in and purchase a shirt if we run out. There are two experienced members of the committee familiar with creating and purchasing merchandise, and they feel this order would not exceed \$10.00 per shirt or \$1000.00. We would like to submit a “not to exceed” motion at this time but fully understand if the ASC body would want to wait for the bids. So feedback on this would be appreciated.

The committee also discussed whether this committee should be a standing committee. The consensus is to reach out to other areas and gather information to present the findings at our next ASC meeting in September.
