CHAIR - Justin & CO CHAIR - Heather

Good Afternoon ASC,

Heather & myself had the opportunity to attend the CAR Workshop. We will be passing out a pamphlet for GSRs to take back to your group to fill out, and the regional delegate will be at our next area to collect them all.

Heather met with the Treasurer over at US BANK. She was added to the account as a signer. Kat will also be added this coming Monday as a signer as well.

We met to go over the upcoming executive budget for this year. Our budget last year was \$4,000.00; today, we will be submitting our budget of \$4,500.00. Last year, we came just barely under our budget.

SECRETARY - Nanette

Good afternoon ASC,

I was able to meet with Heather and Elizabeth, not only the knowledge but also the stuff for the Secretary was passed to me. I gathered three quotes from places in Cedar City that would be able to print black and white, on both sides. Going postal was .43 per page, Kolob Printing was .32 per page, and the UPS store was .20 per page, and after printing 50 pages, the price would drop in price. I used UPS for the prints this month. I will be submitting two proposals this month, one for a reimbursement of \$22.61 for our printing needs at UPS, which I gave the receipt to Angie, as well as one for \$50 for our printing supplies for next month. If you have not been receiving the monthly minutes or would like to add your email to the master list, please see me after ASC. We received an email from Deanna H. in Las Vegas about some fundraising events going on, as well as their registration is up and going, and you can visit the website circleofsisters.org to register for the upcoming convention, March 5-7, 2027. The basic registration is \$50, and the full package is \$250. Richfield also emailed in their report, as well as let me know that they zelled their donation of 7.69.

TREASURER'S REPORT - Angie

Hello ASC,

Happy Spring, everyone! I am pleased to report it has been a very productive month over here in treasurer land. I want to give a big thank you to Justin for letting Erica at the Cedar City branch of US Bank, as we were potentially changing banks due to all the issues we have been having. I was immediately contacted and had an hour-long phone call the following day to rectify not only the Zelle situation but also the security concerns we were having with the St. George branch. This did make adding Heather and Michael as signers quite a bit more time-consuming and difficult, but I definitely feel much better about keeping NA's money where it is. As a heads up, the minutes for the months that nominations are passed will have to be detailed with our full name of Narcotics Anonymous of Southern Utah as well as last names and signatures of the treasurer and those being added as signers. While discussing the importance of Zelle with Erica I was invited to review a couple other options for people to be able to make donations to our area bank account via credit or debit cards. However, there would be fees/surcharges applied. We can discuss this during open forum if you would like. Regarding the business license renewal, that has been taken care of just in the nick of time. I was informed that if we had not gotten this handled when we did, it would have been canceled. I will be sure to teach the future treasurer how to take care of this so we are not at risk of losing that license in the future. This month we are working on getting our PO Box renewed and the taxes taken care of. I will be teaching Mike how to do these tasks so at least he will be prepared when this time comes next year. As a reminder, we are at the end of our fiscal year and budgets will need to be submitted. I want to bring up the fact that as of right now we still have over \$7,000 sitting in subcommittee budgets that were not used. Let's all do our part to be mindful of what is actually needed so we are not sitting on money that could be helping the still suffering addict in other ways. I think that is all for now. Our ending balance was \$17,820.11. Our prudent and operating reserves are \$4,000. Our remaining sub-committee budgets are \$7,766.34. That brings the available balance to \$6,053.77. Heather mentioned that today is the day to submit their budgets. Heather also went over the Group Conscience Collection Sheet. It was suggested that they break up the 5 motions between homegroup members. The RDA will be in attendance at April's ASC to gather the sheets. The CAR Report is attached with everything else under the RCM Report.

Nanette- Is submitting three proposals. One is for \$40 for KKCB rent, one is for reimbursement for \$22.61 for secretary printing needs, and the last one is for \$50 for printing needs for next month. Angie asked if instead of doing reimbursement if we can add a debit card to it and pay that way so it not only skips a step but also shows we are tax exempt if an account can be opened up. Nanette will ask UPS store next time she goes in.

Rennie- Will be submitting proposal for Splash me, I'm Irish event for \$225, breakdown is Venue for \$70, Pizza for \$120, water and Ice for \$35. Will also be submitting a proposal for Huntin in Recovery event for a \$400 breakdown: \$150 for burgers and buns, \$50 for condiments, \$50 for Easter Eggs, \$100 for Candy, and \$50 for Prizes. There was a discussion about how the proposal will come back, and money won't be approved until after the event. Rennie stated that the members of CCGC will pay for the event and get reimbursed if it passes, but if not, then the members will eat the costs. Rennie also submitted CCGC's budget for \$4,610 breakdown is May event for \$200, June event for \$350, July event for \$300, August event for \$300, September event for \$700, October event for \$150, November event for \$250, December event for \$500, January event for \$100, February event for \$150, March event for \$250, April event for \$400, meeting space for \$240 (\$20/month), Storage Unit \$720 (\$60/month). Melanie- Melanie was there as our RDA and was available to answer questions in regards to the CAR report. She also invited all individuals to go online and do the survey which the link is

attached under RCM report. The individual votes are due by April 1st. Melanie invited anyone that may have questions to reach out to her at 702-321-3445.

Patrick- Brought up how CCGC would like to have a position added in their subcommittee for Treasurer, and a proposal was added for it. He discussed how CCGC managed its own money for the first 5 years that they were up and running. They would run it just like SUACNA runs their account. They would submit their budget. If it gets approved, the money would go into their own account, and every month, they would attach their statement. At the end of the year, the money would go back into AREA's account until their next budget was approved. Angie discussed how, with all the transactions that CCGC does, it would make sense for them to have their own account. A member discussed how Area Entertainment and CCGC are pretty much the same and if Area Entertainment could potentially have their own account, but at this time, they only throw 4 events a year, so their isn't a lot of transactions. Rennie brought up how CCGC and Area could potentially work together by supporting each other's events. It was also brought up how it seems that the entertainment chair was always from St. George; what if someone from Cedar did it? It was mentioned how a member from Cedar was a part of the committee, and asked about having an event in Cedar, and it was a hard no. Then Zoom was canceled, and the member couldn't make it anymore. It was brought up how there seems to be this divide between Cedar City and St. George. It was noted that a member with 17 years of clean would be willing to serve as Treasurer. A member raised the question of how guidelines would be created and submitted to ASC.

Michael - Will submit a reimbursement proposal for \$6.85 to buy a folder for the year 2026. Will also be submitting their budget of \$107. Breakdown is \$10.00 for a yearly folder for 2027, \$75 for ziplock bags, \$12 for Receipt books, and \$10 for pens.


